## STAR Fund Now Accepting Applications

Are you a farmer or rancher impacted by the wildfires in the Panhandle? We have funds to help you rebuild after this disaster. The STAR Fund can help you rebuild fences, restore operations and pay for other ag-related disaster relief. If a producer lives in a county where a disaster declaration has been issued by the governor, you have 60 days from the date of the governor's proclamation to turn in an application.

## Feral Hog Update, Scimetrics Withdraws Registration for Kaput Feral Hog Bait

In late April, Scimetrics Inc., the manufacturer of Kaput pest management products, requested to withdraw their state registration for a feral hog toxicant. Below is a snippet of Commissioner Miller's response to their request.

"As a privately-owned company, Scimetrics is wholly within its right to ask for their product registration to be withdrawn, effectively prohibiting its use in the state of Texas. While this request is unfortunate, the Texas Department of Agriculture respects their position and will close the registration. However, the debate over feral hog bait has always been over issues larger than just one product. As Texas Agriculture Commissioner, I am disappointed that landowners, farmers and ranchers will lose this tool to fight back against the growing economic threat of feral hogs. This is just another kick in the teeth for rural Texas."

## Urban School Grant Program Deadline Approaching

TDA is looking forward to another great round of Urban Schools Agricultural Grant projects. The mission of this grant program is to improve urban students' understanding and appreciation of agriculture. This program provides funding for hands-on projects to teach urban children about the role that agriculture plays in their daily lives. Teachers utilize these projects to enhance science, math and writing programs at their schools. Many projects even extend beyond the classroom to incorporate community involvement with students' families, agricultural professionals and/or agricultural associations.

To date, more than 72 Texas elementary and middle schools have participated in this innovative grant program. Project funds must be used to enhance students' understanding of agriculture and cannot be used for campus beautification.

This is an exciting opportunity for school districts to expand their educational outreach or build upon the success of existing programs. TDA encourages school districts all across the state to develop a proposal and apply for this exciting program. The deadline to submit applications is **Thursday, May 25**.

## Brahman Bulls: From Texas to Thailand

On Wednesday, April 12, TDA oversaw the shipment of four Brahman bulls from Texas to Thailand — one of the first air shipments of live cattle to take off from Houston's George Bush Intercontinental Airport in more than 20 years. The Brahman bulls, which were bred and raised on ranches outside of Houston, will be used for breeding stock in the Asian market.

All cattle leaving the country must be inspected at TDA holding facilities called export pens. Once the livestock are inspected and all export requirements are met — including a mandatory rest period — the cattle are loaded for transport to destinations all over the world by air and sea from Houston.

We'll give you a firsthand look at the journey these Brahman bulls took as they prepared to board their flight to Thailand in the latest edition of TDA's *Texas Agriculture Matters* video series, which is set to debut soon on [TDA's Facebook page](#). In the video, you'll see our team's visit to [J.D. Hudgins, Inc.](#) in Hungerford, Texas, where we talked with one of the owners about their longstanding family history with the Brahman breed and what it takes to export these animals to other countries.
