TDA Serves up New Software to School Nutrition Programs

TDA is rolling out an exciting new software platform for all Texas school nutrition programs called the Menu Enhancement Nutrition (MENU) Module. What's exciting is that school districts in Texas will be able to use the software to analyze the nutrients in the foods they serve, making it easier to comply with federal guidelines, and it's available at no cost to the district.



Additionally, MENU will simplify the process for school districts when they're submitting documents for TDA's review of their operations. MENU even has features to assist school districts in choosing Texas products for their menus. Instantaneous communication is vital to the success of serving school meals today, and MENU includes a mobile app that allows school nutrition teams to communicate with children and parents about upcoming meals, special events and important nutrition news. Families and students can also rate meals served using a star system.

Commissioner Miller Signs Historic Agreement in Israel to Encourage Agricultural Trade and Build Partnership

Commissioner Miller signed a <u>historic agreement</u> with Israeli leaders last month to encourage agricultural trade with Texas and strengthen the relationship between Texas and our greatest ally in the Middle East, Israel.

The "Declaration of Cooperation" between Commissioner Miller, on behalf of TDA, and Chairman Yossi Dagan, on behalf of the Shomron Regional Council of the State of Israel, was signed in the Israeli Knesset, or parliament.

"I am proud to represent the people of Texas and sign this historic accord to renew the spirit of cooperation and friendship between Texas and Israel," Commissioner Miller said. "As an eighthgeneration farmer and rancher, I am here to send a strong message that Texas agriculture producers and other Texas-based companies are ready to do business with the people of Israel."

During his time in Israel, Commissioner Miller visited with several high-ranking Israeli government officials, as well as representatives from a host of companies who are seeking to do business with Texas. Gildad Erdan, Public Security and Strategic Affairs Minister (Likud) for the State of Israel, was also present at the signing ceremony. In addition to his visit's agriculture-related itinerary, Commissioner Miller's presence in the West Bank had broader implications for U.S.-Israeli relations.



TDA Establishes New Office of Produce Safety

We are excited to announce TDA's new Office of Produce Safety that is geared towards helping producers understand and comply with the requirements of the Food Safety Modernization Act (FSMA) and the Food and Drug Administration's (FDA) "Standards for the Growing, Harvesting, Packing and Holding of Produce for Human Consumption" (commonly referred to as the Produce Safety Rule). The purpose of FSMA is to shift food safety regulations toward a more modern system designed to prevent food contamination. New enforcement actions are designed to achieve higher rates of compliance with preventative safety standards.

Through FSMA, FDA now has the tools it needs to hold imported food to the same high standards as domestically-sourced food. Through a cooperative agreement, TDA is working to advance efforts for a nationally-integrated food safety system that encourages the safe production of fresh fruits and vegetables. TDA is creating the necessary infrastructure and will conduct producer outreach, education and inspections based on FSMA. To learn more, click <u>here</u>. STAR Fund: Call for Donations, Aid Available to Assist Victims of Wildfires

Commissioner Miller continues his call for his fellow Texans to donate to the State of Texas Agriculture Relief Fund (STAR Fund) and lend a helping hand to our neighbors impacted by the devastating wildfires in the Panhandle.

As farmers and ranchers continue assessing the damage and rebuilding their lives, Commissioner Miller is also encouraging them to apply for assistance through the STAR Fund. If a producer lives in a county where a disaster declaration has been issued by the governor, they have 60 days from the date of the governor's proclamation to turn in an application. The STAR Fund was created to collect monetary contributions from private individuals and businesses to assist farmers and ranchers in



responding to and recovering from natural disasters like the latest series of wildfires that burned a trail of destruction across the Panhandle. Funds may be used to rebuild perimeter fences, pay for livestock burial costs, restore operations and assist with other agricultural relief efforts — basically anything that isn't covered under federal farm assistance or insurance programs.

"Many of our fellow Texans are in need of a helping hand, and all Texans have an opportunity to really help people by donating to the STAR Fund," Commissioner Miller said. "Farmers and ranchers are trying to rebuild fences, clean up their properties and pick up the pieces after this devastating tragedy. That's where the STAR Fund comes into play and why it was created — to help folks out with things federal money and insurance won't cover."
