
Community Application Steps

Conduct Public Hearing	April 2, 2024
Develop Community Needs List	
Adopt local governing body resolution(s)	April 3, 2024
Complete and submit Community Application in TDA- GO	April 3, 2024



Step 1: Initiate Application

Local staff login to TDA-GO system and create new application.



Add additional staff, as needed. Complete Support Ticket to add third-party users to document.



Step 2: Publish Public Notices

 Schedule public meeting to discuss community needs and solicit input citizens.

 Hearing must be conducted between Sept. 1, 2023 and April 2, 2024

 See App Guide for public notice requirements, Appendix A for public notice format



Step 3: Conduct Public Hearing

 See App Guide for topics that must be covered during meeting.

 NEW! Sample script available in Appendix A

 Meeting minutes and notes should be retained locally for future reference



Step 4: Develop Community Needs List

- Identify 10-15 community needs
- App guides provide "common" needs section for reference
- Email

Step 5: Adopt resolution(s)

 Local government to authorize submission of Community Application

 Required resolution format provided in Appendix A – update fillable information fields prior to adoption.



Step 6: Complete Community Application in TDA-GO

- Complete forms in TDA-GO application and submit!
- NEW no certification page in Community App (Part 1).

Downtown Revitalization Program (DRP)



Program Goal and National Program Objective (NPO)

- DRP provides funding for infrastructure improvements to promote pedestrian-centered economic activity.
- NPO: Elimination of slum and/or blighted conditions



Definition of a Downtown Area

- a. The city's historic area of commerce or economic center of the community;
- b. The area around the courthouse or city square, if the improvements will primarily serve non-governmental buildings; and/or
- c. The primary business or retail district for the community that does not include single-family dwellings.

- Incorporated municipality
 - Downtown District; or
 - THC Main Street Community

- Grant award of \$500,000
- Minimum match amount \$17,500

Sidewalks are deteriorated and unsafe	Replace sidewalks in multiple locations	03L
Businesses in the downtown area are not accessible due to difference in door frame heights and lack of curb cuts	Install ADA-compliant ramps and level sidewalks	03L
Downtown area is unlit at night	Install street lights on north- south roads in the downtown area	03L
Streets in the downtown area are deteriorated	Reconstruct roads in the downtown area	03K

 51% of funds towards sidewalk improvements and related accessibility improvements that comply with ADA

Scoring Factor: Match Ratio

Match Ratio	15 Points
A minimum 3.5% cash match is required (\$17,500)	
Match equals at least 5% (\$25,000)	5
Match equals at least 7% (\$37,500)	10
Match Ratio at least 10% (\$50,000)	15

TxCDBG Program

Colonia Fund: Construction (CFC)

- CFC provides funding for public improvements designated for the benefit of Colonia residents
 - Project located within colonia community
 - Primarily benefits colonia residents

NPO: LMI Area Benefit

Eligible Applicants

- Counties within 150 miles of the Texas-Mexico border
 - Non-entitlement (with exception to Hidalgo)
 - Not located in Community (MSA) with population greater than 1M
 - Adopted Model Subdivision Rules
 - Participating in the TxCDBG 2022 Colonia Planning and Needs Assessment
 - *County may apply for projects involving water systems, utility districts, etc.

Grant Amount: \$1,000,000

Colonia:

- Identifiable community
- Unincorporated
- Located within 150 miles of the Texas-Mexico Border
- Existed as a colonia prior to 1990 under the Cranston-Gonzalez Act
- Is defined by a set of criteria:
 - Lack of potable water supply;
 - Lack of adequate sewage systems; and/or
 - Lack of decent, safe and sanitary housing
