Like many farms and ranches across the state of Texas, organic livestock operations have experienced herd loss and devastation to pasture and rangeland. However, this is doubly troubling for ruminant organic livestock producers due to certain regulations of the USDA National Organic Program (NOP). Sections 205.237(c) and 205.240 of the NOP Regulations require that ruminant animals have a grazing season of at least 120 days and obtain a minimum of 30 percent of their dry matter intake from pasture grazing.

On October 27, 2011 the Texas Department of Agriculture submitted a request to the USDA Agricultural Marketing Service (AMS) for a temporary variance from sections 205.237(c) and 205.240 for organic livestock producers located in the state of Texas. The USDA AMS granted the temporary variance to the 214 counties that were identified as primary natural disaster areas earlier this year. On October 27, 2011, the Department of Agriculture (USDA) received a request for a temporary variance from the National Organic Program (NOP) regulations §§205.237(c) and 205.240, submitted by the Texas Department of Agriculture on behalf of ruminant livestock producers located in several drought stricken Texas counties. The basis for establishing this variance for these Texas counties is documented severe drought conditions. USDA has reviewed the recommendation for a temporary variance for organic ruminant livestock producers according to NOP regulation requirements in §205.290. Based upon the submitted documentation, the request for temporary variance from §§205.237(c) and 205.240 is granted, with restrictions, and is in effect for the 2011 grazing season.

The temporary variance from §§ 205.237(c) and 205.240 is restricted to:

- Organic ruminant livestock producers located in any of the 214 Texas counties designated as primary natural disaster areas on April 4, and June 24, 2011, by USDA Secretary Thomas J. Vilsack.
- Non-irrigated pasture only; producers having access to irrigated pasture are not included in the variance.
- 2011 grazing season only; producers must comply with §§ 205.237(c)(2) and 205.240 for the 2012 grazing season, or submit a new request for Temporary Variance for 2012, as applicable.
