Policy Notes for RFP Procurements:

Competitive Procurement: All administration services related to TxCDBG projects must be procured competitively, regardless of the source of funds that will pay for the service contracts.

- Administration services paid in whole or in part with TxCDBG funds must use the step-by-step procurement procedures described below.
- Administration services paid solely with local or matching funds must use the TxCDBG process or a competitive procurement process found in local policies.

Conflicts of Interest:

- A service provider that intends to respond to the Request for Proposals may provide information on TxCDBG procurement procedures, but may NOT participate in the development or drafting of specifications, requirements, statements of work, or invitations for bids or requests for proposals, including, but not limited to, the development of the scoring criteria, the final selection of firms to be contacted, or the scoring of proposals. (See 2 CFR 200.319(a))
- Engineering firms may qualify to administer a TxCDBG contract; however, the same firm, or any principal or employee thereof, may not perform both engineering and administration on the same TxCDBG contract, regardless of the source of payment.
- No person who might potentially receive benefits from CDBG-assisted activities may participate in the selection, award, or administration of a contract supported by CDBG funding if he or she has a real or apparent conflict of interest.

Eligibility:

- All contractors or service providers, including Councils of Government (COGs) and subcontractors, must have their eligibility status verified (not suspended or debarred) in the System for Award Management (www.SAM.gov) prior to any formal action authorizing the award of a contract to the contractor (examples of formal action include but are not limited to, authorizing resolution, authorizing ordinance, Council /Commissioners Court approval of award, contract execution, etc.). See Chapter 5 for more information.

Reporting: Procurements must be reported to TDA via the online grant management system TDA-GO.

- A Materials and Services Report (MSR-01-A) for administration services is created automatically for each new grant.

Step-by-Step Guide for Selection of Administration Services

Step 1. Establish a local Selection Review Committee and determine the scope of services

The City/County must establish a Selection Review Committee to determine the criteria to select and rate competing Respondents. The committee:

- Must include three or more persons;
- Must include at least one local elected official (such as the mayor or county judge), a member of the elected governing body, or a City/County employee with authority to act on behalf of the local elected official in this capacity; and
- May include the entire local governing body, a subset of the governing body, other officers or employees of the locality, employees or officers of third-party public utilities served through the project, or other relevant persons.

Committee members must have no real or apparent conflict of interest with any Respondent under review, including:

- The individual's spouse, including common law relationships,
- A parent, grandparent, sibling, parent, brother, sister, grandparent, grandchild, or child of the individual or their spouse; and
- A person related to the individual by kinship, adoption, or marriage who resides in the same household.

Once the Selection Committee has been established, upload the Selection Review Committee Appointment form to the Materials and Services Report (MSR-01-A) in TDA-GO identifying the committee members. ([Click here to view Selection Review Committee Appointment](#))

Step 2. Determine the Scope of Services

Determine the scope of services needed to successfully administer the TxCDBG grant agreement. The scope of work should itemize the tasks needed, with timeframes and achievable goals. ([Click here to view Sample Scope of Services](#))

If the City/County is participating in multiple TxCDBG application cycles or grant agreements, several steps in these processes may be completed once for all procurement being conducted concurrently. However, the scope of services must be documented separately for each potential contract:

- Each service contract must address only one stand-alone TxCDBG grant or application.
- Services for preparation of an application and services for grant administration / implementation must be clearly separated, either in separate contracts or separate phases of the same contract. Costs associated with application preparation services are NOT eligible costs under the TxCDBG program.
- Services procured more than two Program Years in advance of the application due date will not be accepted by TDA. Example: A City/County may issue an RFP in 2026 for TxCDBG applications in 2027 and 2028, but an RFP for administration services for a 2029 application would not be acceptable.

Step 3. Develop written evaluation criteria

Develop written weighted criteria that will be used to evaluate proposals and determine the contract selection award based on the proposed CDBG project. Cost must be included in the evaluation and selection criteria. The local governing body, which has final authority to approve all administration/professional services contracts, should be closely involved in the establishment of these

Step 4. Develop the Request for Proposals (RFP)

Develop a RFP package to issue to potential Respondents. The RFP package must contain the following three parts. ([Click here to view Sample RFP](#))

- **Cover Letter**
- **Request for Proposals (RFP)**
 - Scope of services, including specifications and attachments, clearly describing the work required.
 - Grant Administration Services Rating Sheet (or similar written evaluation criteria) identifying the factors that will be used to determine the contract selection award.
 - Outline of the requirements for a proposal / response:
 - Statement of Qualifications
 - Proposed cost of services/fee structure;
 - Related experience with federal programs;
 - Capacity to perform the specific proposed task;
 - Experience in developing and/or implementing civil rights/equal opportunity/fair housing activities; and
 - References – list of past/current clients
- **Sample Contract**
 - Update the TxCDBG sample administration contract to include relevant information for the City/County and the proposed application / grant. ([Click here to view Sample Contract](#))
 - Include the Conflict of Interest Questionnaire (Texas Ethics Commission)

If multiple contracts are anticipated to be awarded from the same procurement effort, a separate RFP and Sample Contract is required for each. The cover letter must clearly indicate the proposals that are being solicited. Responses must, at a minimum, include separate proposed cost schedules.

Step 5. Advertise the RFP

Advertise RFP in a locally distributed newspaper. This may be a paper published in the community, or a regional paper that is available locally. Retain proof of advertisement (tear sheet or clipping with publisher's affidavit). The proposal deadline must be no less than 10 (ten) days after the publication of the advertisement and contact date of the RFP. ([Click here to view Sample Newspaper Advertisement](#))

Post / report the RFP to at least one organization that provides access to procurement opportunities for small and disadvantaged businesses. If none is available in your area, contact TDA to ensure your RFP is identified via TDA-GO. ([Click here to search for local Workforce Solutions Offices / WIOA One Stop Shops](#))

Step 6. Send the RFP to at least five firms or individuals

Prepare a list of potential TDA certified administration/professional services firms/individuals

- Use the Texas Comptroller of Public Accounts Historically Underutilized Business (HUB) Directory / Centralized Master Bidders List (CMBL). ([Click here to search for HUB/CMBL businesses](#))
- Include Section 3 businesses, as well as minority-owned, women-owned, and veteran-owned businesses individuals/firms in the listing. TDA recommends sending the direct solicitation to a minimum of two service providers that meet the definition for SBE, MBE, WBE, VBE or Section 3 business. The City/County must facilitate contracting opportunities for by reporting the RFP to at least one organization. Please refer to Chapters 5 and 10 of the TxCDBG Project Implementation Manual. The City/County must retain documentation verifying compliance.

Send the RFP package to a **minimum of five individuals/firms** by email, fax, and/or return receipt mail.

- Document reasons for selecting such individuals/firms for local files.
- Document evidence of contacting five (5) individuals/ firms.
 - If email/fax, print verifiable evidence that email/fax was **received** by the intended party, such as a Read Receipt.
 - If USPS mail, send with Return Receipt Service required.

The proposal submission deadline must allow at least 10 days after the RFP was sent to these individuals/firms.

Once the solicitations have been sent and delivery receipt confirmed, upload the documentation to the Materials and Services Report (MSR-01-A) in TDA-GO. The RFP Solicitation Record (Form A503) may be used as a resource to track this requirement.

Step 7. Evaluate proposals

After the proposal submission deadline, review each proposal received by the deadline and evaluate the Respondent's experience, work performance, and capacity to perform either:

- By using prior experience with Respondent(s); and/or
- By contacting all references for the Respondent.

Apply the established evaluation criteria to score each Respondent and document ratings.

Step 8. Select Respondent and verify eligibility

Determine the most responsive and responsible Respondent whose proposal is most advantageous to the City/County, considering price and all evaluation factors.

As necessary, the City/County may conduct negotiations with all Respondents who are deemed responsive and responsible and fall within a competitive price range, based on the City/County's evaluation of Respondents' pricing and technical proposals. After negotiations, these Respondents may be given the opportunity to submit a best and final offer. Retain records verifying the negotiation process with each Respondent, including the best and final offer from each Respondent.

Step 9. Award the Contract

Prepare the contract for execution by all parties

- SAM.gov Eligibility: Prior to awarding the contract, check the Respondent's status in the System for Award Management (SAM) to verify the Respondent is eligible to participate in the contract if awarded (is not suspended or debarred). (www.SAM.gov) ([Click here to view SAM verification process](#))
- Update the sample contract from the RFP packet to include the appropriate Respondent's information.
- If awarding prior to the grant agreement, include a statement that, in the event TxCDBG funds

are not awarded to the City/County, the contract shall be terminated by City/County.

Present the selection to the City Council/Commissioner's Court for award.

- The local governing body has the final authority to award contracts.
- If a Respondent not recommended by the Selection Committee is awarded, the minutes of the local governing body meeting must include justification for the selection.

Update the MSR with all required information and documentation.

1. Scope of Services

PART IV

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

1. Termination for Cause. If the Contractor fails to fulfill in a timely and proper manner its obligations under this Agreement, or if the Contractor violates any of the covenants, conditions, agreements, or stipulations of this Agreement, the City/County shall have the right to terminate this Agreement by giving written notice to the Contractor of such termination and specifying the effective date thereof, which shall be at least five days before the effective date of such termination. In the event of termination for cause, all finished or unfinished documents, data, studies, surveys, drawings, maps, models, photographs and reports prepared by the Contractor pursuant to this Agreement shall, at the option of the City/County, be turned over to the City / County and become the property of the City / County. In the event of termination for cause, the Contractor shall be entitled to receive reasonable compensation for any necessary services actually and satisfactorily performed prior to the date of termination.

Notwithstanding the above, the Contractor shall not be relieved of liability to the City/County for damages sustained by the City/County by virtue of any breach of contract by the Contractor, and the City/County may set-off the damages it incurred as a result of the Contractor's breach of contract from any amounts it might otherwise owe the Contractor.

2. Termination for Convenience of the City/County.

City/County may at any time and for any reason terminate Contractor's services and work at City/County's convenience upon providing written notice to the Contractor specifying the extent of termination and the effective date. Upon receipt of such notice, Contractor shall, unless the notice directs otherwise, immediately discontinue the work and placing of orders for materials, facilities and supplies in connection with the performance of this Agreement.

[Parties should include the manner by which such termination will be effected and the basis for settlement or any other terms and conditions concerning payment upon such termination.]

3. Changes. The City/County may, from time to time, request changes in the services the Contractor will perform under this Agreement. Such changes, including any increase or decrease in the amount of the Contractor's compensation, must be agreed to by all parties and finalized through a signed, written amendment to this Agreement.
4. Resolution of Program Non-Compliance and Disallowed Costs. In the event of any dispute, claim, question, or disagreement arising from or relating to this Agreement, or the breach thereof, including determination of responsibility for any costs disallowed as a result of non-compliance with federal, state or TxCDBG program requirements, the parties hereto shall use their best efforts to settle the dispute, claim, question or disagreement. To this effect, the parties shall consult and negotiate with each other in good faith within 30 days of receipt of a written notice of the dispute or invitation to negotiate, and attempt to reach a just and equitable solution satisfactory to both parties. If the matter is not resolved by negotiation within 30 days of receipt of written notice or invitation to negotiate, the parties agree first to try in good faith to settle the matter by mediation administered by the American Arbitration Association under its Commercial Mediation Procedures before resorting to arbitration, litigation, or some other dispute resolution procedure. The parties may enter into a written amendment to this Agreement and choose a mediator that is not affiliated with the American Arbitration Association. The parties shall bear the costs of such mediation equally. *[This section may also provide for the qualifications of the mediator(s), the locale of meetings, time*

limits, or any other item of concern to the parties.] If the matter is not resolved through such mediation within 60 days of the initiation of that procedure, either party may proceed to file suit.

5. Personnel.

- a. The Contractor represents that he/she/it has, or will secure at its own expense, all personnel required in performing the services under this Agreement. Such personnel shall not be employees of or have any contractual relationship with the City/County.
- b. All of the services required hereunder will be performed by the Contractor or under its supervision and all personnel engaged in the work shall be fully qualified and shall be authorized or permitted under State and Local law to perform such services.
- c. None of the work or services covered by this Agreement shall be subcontracted without the prior written approval of the City/County. Any work or services subcontracted hereunder shall be specified by written contract or agreement and shall be subject to each provision of this Agreement.

6. Assignability. The Contractor shall not assign any interest on this Agreement, and shall not transfer any interest in the same (whether by assignment or novation), without the prior written consent of the City/County thereto; Provided, however, that claims for money by the Contractor from the City/County under this Agreement may be assigned to a bank, trust company, or other financial institution without such approval. Written notice of any such assignment or transfer shall be furnished promptly to the City/County.

7. Reports and Information. The Contractor, at such times and in such forms as the City/County may require, shall furnish the City/County such periodic reports as it may request pertaining to the work or services undertaken pursuant to this Agreement, the costs and obligations incurred or to be incurred in connection therewith, and any other matters covered by this Agreement.

8. Records and Audits. The Contractor shall insure that the City/County maintains fiscal records and supporting documentation for all expenditures of funds made under this contract in a manner that conforms to 2 CFR 200.300-.309, 24 CFR 570.490, and this Agreement. Such records must include data on the racial, ethnic, and gender characteristics of persons who are applicants for, participants in, or beneficiaries of the funds provided under this Agreement. City/County shall retain such records, and any supporting documentation, for the greater of three years from closeout of the Agreement or the period required by other applicable laws and regulations.

9. Findings Confidential. All of the reports, information, data, etc., prepared or assembled by the Contractor under this contract are confidential and the Contractor agrees that they shall not be made available to any individual or organization without the prior written approval of the City/County.

10. Copyright. No report, maps, or other documents produced in whole or in part under this Agreement shall be the subject of an application for copyright by or on behalf of the Contractor.

11. Compliance with Local Laws. The Contractor shall comply with all applicable laws, ordinances and codes of the State and local governments, and the Contractor shall save the City/County harmless with respect to any damages arising from any tort done in performing any of the work embraced by this Agreement.

12. Conflicts of interest.

- a. Governing Body. No member of the governing body of the City/County and no other officer, employee, or agent of the City/County, who exercises any functions or responsibilities in connection with administration, construction, engineering, or implementation of the TxCDBG award between TDA and the City / County shall have any personal financial interest, direct or indirect, in the Contractor or this Agreement; and the Contractor shall take appropriate steps to assure compliance.
 - b. Other Local Public Officials. No other public official who exercises any functions or responsibilities in connection with the planning and carrying out of administration, construction, engineering or implementation of the TxCDBG award between TDA and the City/County shall have any personal financial interest, direct or indirect, in the Contractor or this Agreement; and the Contractor shall take appropriate steps to assure compliance.
 - c. Contractor and Employees. The Contractor warrants and represents that it has no conflict of interest associated with the TxCDBG award between TDA and the City/County or this Agreement. The Contractor further warrants and represents that it shall not acquire an interest, direct or indirect, in any geographic area that may benefit from the TxCDBG award between TDA and the City/County or in any business, entity, organization or person that may benefit from the award. The Contractor further agrees that it will not employ an individual with a conflict of interest as described herein.
13. Debarment and Suspension (Executive Orders 12549 and 12689). The Contractor certifies, by entering into this Agreement, that neither it nor its principals are presently debarred, suspended, or otherwise excluded from or ineligible for participation in federally-assisted programs under Executive Orders 12549 (1986) and 12689 (1989). The term “principal” for purposes of this Agreement is defined as an officer, director, owner, partner, key employee, or other person with primary management or supervisory responsibilities, or a person who has a critical influence on or substantive control over the operations of the Contractor. The Contractor understands that it must not make any award or permit any award (or contract) at any tier to any party which is debarred or suspended or is otherwise excluded from or ineligible for participation in Federal assistance programs under Executive Order 12549, “Debarment and Suspension.”

Federal Civil Rights Compliance.

14. Equal Opportunity Clause (applicable to federally assisted construction contracts and subcontracts over \$10,000).

During the performance of this contract, the Contractor agrees as follows:

- a. The Contractor will not discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because of race, color, religion, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, or national origin. The Contractor will take affirmative action to ensure that applicants are employed, and that employees are treated during employment without regard to their race, color, religion, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, or national origin. Such action shall include, but not be limited to the following: Employment, upgrading, demotion, or transfer; recruitment or recruitment advertising; layoff or termination; rates of pay or other forms of compensation; and selection for training, including apprenticeship. The Contractor agrees to post in conspicuous places, available to employees and applicants for employment, notices to be provided setting forth the provisions of this nondiscrimination clause.
- b. The Contractor will, in all solicitations or advertisements for employees placed by or on behalf of the Contractor, state that all qualified applicants will receive considerations for employment

without regard to race, color, religion, sex, sexual orientation, gender identity, or national origin.

- c. The Contractor will not discourage or in any other manner discriminate against any employee or applicant for employment because such employee or applicant has inquired about, discussed, or disclosed the compensation of the employee or applicant or another employee or applicant. This provision shall not apply to instances in which an employee who has access to the compensation information of other employees or applicants as a part of such employee's essential job functions discloses the compensation of such other employees or applicants to individuals who do not otherwise have access to such information, unless such disclosure is in response to a formal complaint or charge, in furtherance of an investigation, proceeding, hearing, or action, including an investigation conducted by the employer, or is consistent with the contractor's legal duty to furnish information.
- d. The Contractor will send to each labor union or representative of workers with which he has a collective bargaining agreement or other contract or understanding, a notice to be provided advising the said labor union or workers' representatives of the Contractor's commitments under this section, and shall post copies of the notice in conspicuous places available to employees and applicants for employment.
- e. The Contractor will comply with all provisions of Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965, "Equal Employment Opportunity," and of the rules, regulations, and relevant orders of the Secretary of Labor.
- f. The Contractor will furnish all information and reports required by Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965, and by rules, regulations, and orders of the Secretary of Labor, or pursuant thereto, and will permit access to his books, records, and accounts by the administering agency and the Secretary of Labor for purposes of investigation to ascertain compliance with such rules, regulations, and orders.
- g. In the event of the Contractor's noncompliance with the nondiscrimination clauses of this contract or with any of the said rules, regulations, or orders, this contract may be canceled, terminated, or suspended in whole or in part and the Contractor may be declared ineligible for further Government contracts or federally assisted construction contracts in accordance with procedures authorized in Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965, and such other sanctions may be imposed and remedies invoked as provided in Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965, or by rule, regulation, or order of the Secretary of Labor, or as otherwise provided by law.
- h. The Contractor will include the portion of the sentence immediately preceding paragraph (a) and the provisions of paragraphs (a) through (h) in every subcontract or purchase order unless exempted by rules, regulations, or orders of the Secretary of Labor issued pursuant to section 204 of Executive Order 11246 of September 24, 1965, so that such provisions will be binding upon each subcontractor or vendor. The Contractor will take such action with respect to any subcontract or purchase order as the administering agency may direct as a means of enforcing such provisions, including sanctions for noncompliance: Provided, however, That in the event a Contractor becomes involved in, or is threatened with, litigation with a subcontractor or vendor as a result of such direction by the administering agency the Contractor may request the United States to enter into such litigation to protect the interests of the United States.

15. Civil Rights Act of 1964. 16. Section 109 of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974. The Contractor shall comply with the provisions of Section 109 of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974. 17. Section 504 Rehabilitation Act of 1973, as amended. 18. Age Discrimination Act of 1975. The Contractor shall comply with the Age Discrimination Act of 1975 which provides that no person in the United States shall on the basis of age be excluded from participation in, be denied the benefits of, or be subjected to discrimination under any program or activity receiving federal financial assistance.
19. Economic Opportunities for Section 3 Residents and Section 3 Business Concerns.
 - (a) The work to be performed under this Contract is subject to the requirements of section 3 of the Housing and Urban Development (HUD) Act of 1968, as amended, 12 U.S.C. 1701u (section 3). The purpose of section 3 is to ensure that employment and other economic opportunities generated by HUD assistance or HUD-assisted projects covered by section 3, shall, to the greatest extent feasible, be directed to low- and very low-income persons, particularly persons who are recipients of HUD assistance for housing.
 - (b) The parties to this Contract agree to comply with HUD's regulations in 24 CFR part 75, which implement section 3. As evidenced by their execution of this Contract, the parties to this Contract certify that they are under no contractual or other impediment that would prevent them from complying with the part 75 regulations.
 - (c) The Contractor agrees to include this section 3 clause in every subcontract subject to compliance with regulations in 24 CFR part 75, and agrees to take appropriate action, as provided in an applicable provision of the subcontract or in this section 3 clause, upon a finding that the subcontractor is in violation of the regulations in 24 CFR part 75. The Contractor will not subcontract with any subcontractor where the Contractor has notice or knowledge that the subcontractor has been found in violation of the regulations in 24 CFR part 75.
 - (d) The Contractor will certify that any vacant employment positions, including training positions, that are filled (1) after the Contractor is selected but before the contract is executed, and (2) with persons other than those to whom the regulations of 24 CFR part 75 require employment opportunities to be directed, were not filled to circumvent the Contractor's obligations under 24 CFR part 75. Minimum expectations of effort to direct employment opportunities to such workers are identified in the TxCDBG Project Implementation Manual.

(e) Noncompliance with HUD's regulations in 24 CFR part 75 may result in sanctions, termination of this Contract for default, and debarment or suspension from future HUD assisted contracts.

- (B) a transaction conducted at a price and subject to terms available to the public; or
- (C) a purchase or lease of goods or services from a person that is chartered by a state or federal agency and that is subject to regular examination by, and reporting to, that agency.

Local Government Code § 176.003(a)(2)(A) and (B):

(a) A local government officer shall file a conflicts disclosure statement with respect to a vendor if:

(2) the vendor:
