2022 FAST Application Overview



- What is the FAST Fund?
 - Reimbursement grant
 - Built infrastructure not eligible
 - Source of funds is deobligated funding
 - Estimated \$7-8 million available
- **Grant maximum:** \$750,000
- **Grant minimum:** \$50,000
- Match: \$7,500
- **Due Date:** July 29, 2022 at 11:59pm CST
 - Staff available until 5:00pm CST
- Applications initiated, signed and submitted in TDA-GO

- Eligible Applicants: Non-entitlement cities and counties
- Service Providers:
 - Volunteer Fire Departments
 - Fire Departments
 - Emergency Service Districts
 - Hospital Districts
 - Hospitals
 - Private 3rd party emergency service providers

Eligible Activities:

- Fire trucks (most types)
- Ambulances
- Other specialized emergency vehicles (with TDA approval prior to application submission)
- Vehicle extrication equipment (saws, cutters, rams)
- SCBAs
- Thermal imaging cameras
- Fire protection gear (bunker gear, helmets, boots)
- Power stretchers and stretcher mounting systems
- Cardiac monitors
- Transport ventilators

• Ineligible Activities:

- Vehicles used primarily for law enforcement
- Command vehicles, rescue boats or water/aircraft
- Don't meet a specific public safety or emergency rescue requirement
- Used primarily for the general conduct of government
- Items such as generators, ladders, tools, or equipment sets
- Supplies (e.g., restocking equipment, disposable items and refills)
- Vehicle components
- Previously owned, used, remounted, recertified, or refurbished equipment or vehicles
- Self-administered conversions of vehicle(s)

Eligibility - Special Considerations

- Warranties are eligible
- No vehicle/Equipment quantity limit
- Manufacturer/seller training can be eligible
- Applicants and Service Providers are responsible for meeting federal, state and local standards or requirements
- TDA reserves the right to:
 - Limit the number or projects recommended for award
 - Offer partial awards for equipment only
 - Decline the proposed vehicle(s) or equipment if they do not meet reasonable standards, <u>as</u> determined by TDA.

NPO & Service Area Eligibility

- Each TxCDBG project must meet at least one of three HUD National Program Objectives (NPO)
- FAST NPO = Low-to-Moderate income (LMI) Area Benefit (LMA)
- Primary Service Area LMA requirements:
 - Must be primarily residential; AND
 - Must Benefit at least 51.00% LMI persons (not 50.99%)
- **Primary Service Area:** geographic area where the proposed project's beneficiaries reside
 - Excludes mutual aid areas (Shall not prevent the Applicant/Service Provider from providing mutual aid)

Two types of Service Areas:

- Community Wide
- Targeted

Service Area Evaluation

- Primarily residential or non-residential uses?
 - Airports, seaports, manufacturing facilities and military bases not eligible stand-alone service areas
- 51.00% LMI?
 - Determine the income status of the households (aka beneficiaries) in the service area
 - TxCDBG low-to-moderate income: at or below 80% of AMFI
 - Provide beneficiary documentation with application



Two ways to document beneficiaries:

- 1. HUD's Low-Moderate Income Summary Data (aka LMISD)
 - Anticipated 2022 LMISD release during FAST application period
 - Applicants must use <u>most recent</u> LMISD
- 2. Income surveys (as per TxCDBG methodology)
 - Use for service areas not "reasonably delineated" by census geographies
 - Anticipated 2022 Income Limits release during FAST application period.
 - » Survey complete prior to TDA posting 2022 questionnaires = no action
 - » Survey started after TDA posts 2022 questionnaires = must uses 2022 questionnaires
 - » Survey in progress when TDA posts 2022 questionnaires = 2021 questionnaires allowed until day of posting but must use 2022 version after



Geographic area is partially overlain by a service area

- Examples: service area = half a city or a portion of a county
- Applicants must determine % of block group population located within service area (calculated at block level)
- Documentation of calculations must be submitted with application or risk disqualification
- See TxCDBG NPO guide for methodology

Other forms of documenting beneficiaries are ineligible

- LMISD/Surveys must adhere to TxCDBG issued guidance
- Failure to heed guidance = Application Disqualification (DQ)

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- Administrative costs cannot exceed the lesser of \$45,000 or 16% of TxCDBG 03O funds
- Pre-agreement Costs:
 - Limited to administrative costs necessary to complete environmental review and competitive procurement of vehicle(s)/equipment within 90 days of award
 - Pre-agreement period begins with application due date and ends on FAST contract start date

Budget Justification

FAST 2022 Budget Justification:

- Vehicle/equipment quotes not being requested for budget justification
- Applicants/Service Providers to complete, sign and submit Service Provider Statement (TDA-GO)
 - Statement documents needs, estimated budget, service areas and existing vehicles/equipment
 - Goal is to provide flexibility by documenting sufficient justification for project approval/award without finalizing exact scope during application phase
- Service Provider Statement is not intended to be used as a means of submitting "placeholder information". Should be based on reality

Post-Award Requirements

90-day items

- Environmental Review
 - Submitted via TDA-GO
- Procurement
 - Applicant or Service provider may procure
 - Must comply with competitive procurement requirements
 - Procurement options:
 - 3rd Party Purchasing Cooperatives
 - Traditional sealed bids process
 - Small purchase
- Vehicle/Equipment detail: TDA-GO
 - Only accessible to FAST Grant Awardees

Post-Award Considerations

- Eighteen (18) month contract term
- Five (5) year compliance period
 - Annual Report submitted through TDA-GO
- Interlocal required between Applicants and unaffiliated service providers
 - Details in the Grant Agreement
 - Not necessary with application
